

Greetings Peoria Citizens!

The year is coming to a close and it has been a whirlwind of busy activity in the Tribal Administration Building. As the year ends here is an overview of the Tribal Office's activities since September.

The office staff has been busy, with their normal duties, but also has been working on various new projects and a bit of fall cleaning. The lobby has had a minor transformation as staff has updated and displayed items we have for sale from the Trading Post. This is a small change but has had a great impact on the lobby! If you have not been in the offices for a while, stop by and take a look.

Not only has the lobby furniture been moved around, there is a new face greeting and welcoming calls and visitors. Lacie Hickey, previously in the Environmental Department has transferred to the Receptionist/Education

Director. Do not be alarmed, Mandie Ferguson has not left the Peoria offices! Mandie has been the Receptionist for over 16 years and when the opportunity to transfer to the CCDF Department arose, she made the decision to relocate. We have truly enjoyed Mandie as the greeter to our offices and know she will be successful in her new position with our Tribe.

With that in mind, we have already received a grant from the Department of Justice, Office of Crime Victims.

The Election Committee has met, and the wheels are in motion for a Special Election for the vacant position on the Grievance Committee. The Special Election has been set for January 12, 2019. In the near future a mailing should be arriving to each eligible voter to notify them of the Annual Election. I would like to take this time to invite you and your family to attend the Annual Meeting. The Annual Meeting will be on March 2, 2019 and this is a time to gather, be informed and look to the future of our Tribe. I would urge you to attend and bring your family and yes, your children. This involvement and gathering is how we are going to build our youth to be the leaders of our future. I look forward to seeing you in March.

The ability to network and build relationships with other Tribes and Tribal organizations is an important component to our future as Native people.



The Peoria Tribal Burial Assistance Benefit is \$10,000 per member. All Burial Assistance Applications must be completed and returned with an original certified death certificate no later than 180 days from the date of death. All deceased must be enrolled members of the Peoria Tribe. Payment will be made directly to the funeral home. Please visit with the funeral home concerning this policy. - Frequent thoughts of death




How to treat your winter blues:

AVAILABLE

INDIAN HEALTH SERVICE WATER AND SEWER ASSISTANCE

The Indian Health Service, Miami Office of Environmental Health and Engineering, offers programs to install water and sewer facilities to qualified Indian Homeowners. Funding and construction of sanitation facilities, such as wells, water service lines, septic tanks and drain fields, wastewater lagoons and sewer service lines, are available.

Minimum eligibility requirements include:

- Property must be located within the boundaries of the nine tribes of the Inter-tribal Council, Inc. of Northeast Oklahoma in Ottawa and Delaware Counties, Oklahoma.
- 2. You must be a member of a federally recognized Indian tribe, band or group.
- 3. The home must be Indian owned and occupied.
- 4. HUD homes must be paid in full before services can be provided.

Documentation of tribal affiliation and home ownership or long-term lease (5 years minimum) will be required with the application for services. Mobile homes must be tied down, skirted and wheels removed prior to service.

Please note that applying for service does not guarantee you will receive service. Service depends on the availability of funding.

Child Care Development Fund Program

The child care program is funded through the Administration for Children and Families (ACF). This program is to provide childcare services and activities. The qualifications for the program are:

- There will always be a co-pay per child per month for each family.
- Live within 100 miles of the Peoria Tribal Office in the states of Missouri, Kansas, Arkansas, or Oklahoma.
- There must be an individual that is a member of a federally recognized tribe residing in the household.
- Be under 13 years of age; or be under the age 19 and physically or mentally incapable of caring for them selves; or under court supervision.
- Reside with a family whose income does not exceed the maximum net income level, there will be some deductions considered. Income level does not apply to the children that are physically or mentally incapable of caring for themselves.
- Co-pay **example**: Monthly net income of \$4,596.00 for a family of four, the co-pay would be \$124.00 per child per month. Every family will have a co-pay.
- Reside with a parent, parents or guardian who are gainfully employed or attending a job training or educational program; or receive, or need to receive, protective services.
- Adult must be at work or in class in order for the CCDF Program to assist with child care.

Every Peoria college student is encouraged to apply. Financial need is not one of the criteria for the Peoria scholarship.

It is never too early to obtain a scholarship application. You may do so by writing Education Director, Peoria Tribe, P.O. Box 1527, Miami, OK 74355; by phoning the Peoria office 1-918-540-2535 ext 10 or 1-800-259-9987 ext 10; or check it out on the Peoria Tribal website, www.peoriatribe.com.

Application deadlines are July 31 for the Fall semester and January 7 for the Spring semester.

Incomplete or postage due applications will not be considered. Students who accept scholarship funds but do not complete their obligation for that semester or maintain a 2.5 GPA forfeit their eligibility until they complete a semester on their own.

Guidelines

- Student must be an enrolled member of the Peoria Tribe of Indians of Oklahoma.
- Must provide with application a copy of the student's tribal membership card.
- Student must be currently enrolled in grades K-12.
- <u>Must provide original letter on official letterhead from school certifying the student's enrollment for current school year</u>, or a <u>print off of the students current schedule or grades</u>.
- Maximum amount is \$500 per school year.
- Must provide original receipts, <u>no copies will be accepted</u>. However, copies will be accepted on a case by case basis.
 Receipts submitted must be dated between <u>May 1, 2018-May 31, 2019</u> and show date and amount of transaction with description of item purchased.

Examples of costs allowable for reimbursement under this program include paper, pencils, notebooks, backpacks, shoes, clothes, school uniforms, lab fees, activity fees, summer school fees, or other fees charged by the school system. All costs must be itemized on a printed receipt and submitted with the Program Application.

All submitted receipts for the school year 2018-19 must be dated between May 1, 2018-May 31, 2019. Any receipts submitted not falling between these dates will be returned.

All applications for reimbursements must be submitted to the Education Director at the Peoria Tribal Office.

Only one application will be accepted per student per period. Each student can only be reimbursed 3 times per calendar year not to exceed the \$500 maximum.

Elder Care and Disability Reimbursement Program

Program Description

The Peoria Tribe of Indians of Oklahoma has established a program to aid the elderly population that could benefit from an additional funding source to supplement their households, and/or disability needs, without restricting or interfering with other government programs.

The Elder Care and Disability Reimbursement Program (ECDRP) will make available up to \$1000 per fiscal year (April 1st- March 31st) for eligible tribal members. Each eligible tribal member may only choose from one program to receive reimbursement, being limited to 3 requests for services per fiscal year, not to exceed maximum total of \$1000. All denied benefits will be reviewed by a 3 person Review Committee comprised of the Chief and 2 accounting staff members. Individuals will not be permitted to receive benefits as both "elderly" and "disabled."

Applicants may only utilize one program.

Qualifications Criteria:

- Individual must be a <u>current enrolled living member</u> of the Peoria Tribe of Indians of Oklahoma, evidenced by Tribal Enrollment Card to receive benefits.
- Eligible tribal member must be **65 years or older**, evidenced by a Photo I.D. to receive benefits.
- Eligible adult tribal member must provide an award letter or benefit statement from the Social Security Administration (dated within last 90 days), to receive disability benefits. No other proof of disability will be accepted.
- Minors or other disabled individuals already receiving Disability Social Security or SSI benefits payable to a representative payee, will be eligible for tribal reimbursement program. All payments will be made to the representative payee as designated on SSI records. Minors not receiving SSI benefits must have documentation of state or federal Determination of Disability to receive reimbursement.

Eligibility for Reimbursement:

- An approved application <u>signed by applicant or legal representative</u> must be on file. A new application is to be submitted each Fiscal year.
- Submission date of the application will be the date the application is received at the Tribal office.
- ORIGINAL RECEIPT(s) (not copies) must be sent to the tribal office, and be dated within the fiscal year of application date.
- ♦ All receipts must come from the vendor or service provider, contain the vendor's contact information, and a detailed summary of

QUALIFICATIONS OF CANDIDATES

The following qualifications for candidates must be satisfied in accordance with the Constitution of the Peoria Tribe of Indians of Oklahoma:

Article IX, Section 5

Qualifications of Candidates – Any member of the Peoria Tribe who is at least twenty-five (25) years of age on the date of election; and who has never been convicted of a felony in a court of competent jurisdiction, shall qualify as a candidate for membership on the Business Committee or Grievance Committee.

Any member of the Peoria Tribe who files for an elective office and is currently holding another elective Tribal office, will upon filing, immediately resign his or her present office. Resigning from a present office will apply only if an incumbent files for a different elective office.

Article IX, Section 6

Nominations – Nominations for the Business Committee and the Grievance Committee shall be filed with the Election Committee at least forty-five (45) days prior to the election in accordance with the Election Ordinance.

FILING PROCEDURES

Filing procedures are prescribed by the Election Ordinance and governed by the Constitution of the Peoria Tribe of Indians of Oklahoma.

Candidate For Office: Any qualified member of the Peoria Tribe of Indians of Oklahoma who desires his/her name to be placed on the ballot as a candidate for any elective office, shall file a Declaration of Candidacy form with the Election Committee or the Committee's designated representative. The official form shall be provided by the Peoria Tribe. The prospective candidate's membership shall be verified by the Tribal Enrollment Officer and a background investigation conducted by the Election Committee.

Declaration of Candidacy: The Declaration of Candidacy shall be in writing in the form prescribed by the Election Committee and filed in person during normal working hours, at least forty-five (45) days prior to the election, at the Peoria Tribal office building or other designated location. No person shall be a candidate for more than one (1) position on the Business Committee at any time.

Withdrawal: A person seeking an elected office may withdraw his/her Declaration of Candidacy by filing a written notice of withdrawal, in person, with the Election Committee or designated representative. The notice of withdrawal shall be filed during normal working hours at the Peoria Tribal office building or other designated location. Such notice shall contain the candidate's name, address and the position for which he/she is a candidate. Also, such notice shall be signed by the candidate and notarized. If a candidate withdraws after ballots have been printed, the Election Committee shall post notices to that effect at the voting place and within the voting booths and make a line through or otherwise obliterate the candidate's name from the ballots. Any votes cast for a withdrawn candidate shall not be counted.

Verify Qualifications of Candidates: The Election Committee shall review all filings for the elected office to ascertain that the prospective candidates meet the qualifications set forth in Article IX, Section 5 of the Constitution of the Peoria Tribe. The Election Committee shall make these determinations no later than ten (10) days following receipt of Declaration of Candidacy form. If the Election Committee determines that a person is not eligible to be a candidate, the Election Committee or designated representative shall notify that person in writing by certified mail, return receipt requested, of their decision. That person's name shall not be included on the ballot. The ineligible person may appeal, in writing, the Election Committee's decision to the Business Committee at the next monthly meeting of the Business Committee

Indian Pudding

2 cups boiling water 3/4 cup white cornmeal

1 1/3 cup cream or 1/2 & 1/2 1 cup raisins 1/2 cup molasses

1 cup cold water 1/2 tsp. salt

1/4 cup butter, melted 2 eggs slightly beaten

1 tsp. vanilla

1 tsp. cinnamon

Pour boiling water into large mixing bowl. Sprinkle cornmeal over surface of water stirring until all water has been absorbed. Blend in milk, molasses, cold water, salt and butter. Slowly stir mixture into beaten eggs. Add raisins, vanilla and cinnamon. Mix well, pour into buttered 2 quart casserole and bake at 350 degree oven 1 1/2 hours. Serve warm with cream.
